
March Lunch Meeting and Presentation Recap

A recent survey conducted by Traliant titled - "Fear Factor: A 2024 Employee Survey Report on Workplace Violence, Harassment and Mental Health." uncovered the following statistics:

- 25% of employees have witnessed workplace violence happening to another employee
- 12% of employees have been the target of workplace violence themselves
- 44% of employees strongly agree that their employer promotes a speak-up culture

Legislative Update



Florida Legislature

HB 275 / SB 340 – Critical Infrastructure: Received resounding approval and is headed to Gov. DeSantis for signature. The Bill is designed to safeguard infrastructure integral to daily life, commercial activities, and the efficient flow of goods and services across the state. PASSED

- Provides criminal penalties for improperly tampering with critical infrastructure resulting in damages
- Provides enhanced criminal penalties for trespassing upon critical infrastructure
- Provides criminal penalties for unauthorized access to or tampering with specified electronic devices or networks

HB 473 / SB 658 Cybersecurity: Passed by the House and headed to the Senate with an 81-28 vote. This Bill seeks to incentivize companies to embrace robust, nationally-recognized cybersecurity protocols and standards by offering liability protections if there is a data breach. **PASSED**

- Incentivizes companies to embrace robust, nationally recognized cybersecurity protocols and standards by offering liability protections if there is a data breach.
- By incentivizing proactive cybersecurity measures, the bill not only fortifies the resilience of critical infrastructure but also ensures the uninterrupted provision of life-saving services and facilitates commerce.

SB 330: Behavioral Health Teaching Hospitals (Chamber Priority "Live Healthy") PASSED

 Increases access to mental health services through the expansion of educational opportunities for those seeking to enter the mental health profession and the creation of a behavioral health hospital system.

Some 2024 Governor, House, and Senate priorities include the Healthcare Workforce Shortage, Technology (SM, AI, Cybersecurity), and Law and Order

U.S. Legislature

A Proclamation was signed on March 29, 2024, designating April 2024 as National Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month

H.R. 6150: To amend the National Security Act of 1947 to include school security as an element of the National Security Strategy, and for other purposes. The Bill would add a paragraph stating, "To amend the National Security Act of 1947 to include school security as an element of the National Security Strategy, and for other purposes". **No Further Action**

H.R. 2899: To amend the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 to provide for additional grant amounts for protection against mass violence by inserting "\$20,000,000, to be granted by the Attorney General to States, units of local governments, and other nonprofit organizations that serve victims of crime to provide compensation, training, and technical assistance to public assembly facilities to prepare against mass violence and to protect public assembly facilities from mass violence." **No Further Action**




Security Spotlight

Once in a safe place, SP Hall called 911 and waited with the man, talking with him until JSO arrived.

Thanks to the quick action by SP Hall, a life was saved and the individual was able to get the help they needed.


