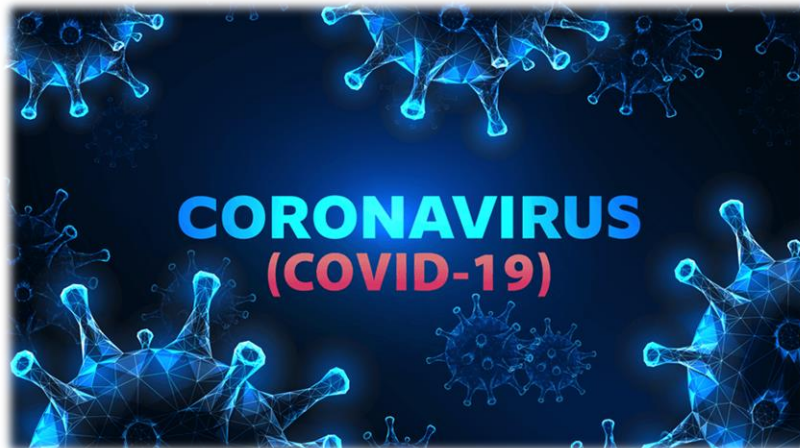

Chris Cannon started his career in the public sector as a police officer for the Columbus Police Department in Columbus, Georgia. After serving the public for 16 years, Cannon transitioned to corporate security and focused his efforts in the retail and supply chain industries before ending up in the healthcare security arena in 2013. He recently relocated to Jacksonville in February 2020, after accepting the role of Director of Physical Security for Nemours Children's Healthcare System. His current position is responsible for developing, building, and supporting a physical security program at the enterprise level, for over 90 locations in 5 different states.

Cannon's passion for physical security and the security industry as a whole became evident after a brief interview where he expressed that he had always wanted to be in law enforcement and thoroughly enjoyed his time there; so much so, that in 2005, he started facilitating university undergraduate criminal justice classes. Cannon had already earned his Master of Public Administration, Justice Administration and wanted to expand his scope outside of public law enforcement and entered the private sector.

Cannon stated that after being in the public sector for so long, it can be difficult to acclimate oneself to the culture and nuances of the private sector. "There is a challenge in understanding the working pieces that surround the organization and how you fit in." Despite these challenges, Cannon believes the building of relationships and trust across an organization and getting them to recognize security as a valued business partner has been one of his greatest accomplishments. "You must always be comfortable in your own skin and never try to clone someone else's style." When asked what are some things that he was doing to encourage others to join the security profession, Cannon stated he made sure he was always passionate about what he did. "Many people don't know exactly what today's security teams and leaders do. Security still has the stereotype to many people of a guard sitting in an old guard shack." Cannon strives to share his experiences and educate others about this industry. "I try to be a good ambassador for the industry and to promote it whenever I can."

Cannon has been married for 26 years and is the proud father of 5 children, with his youngest son graduating high school in 2021, and heading to Georgia State!

Updates for the Florida PI, Security and Safety industry

Florida Commissioner of Agriculture (Nicole Fried) issues [Emergency Order 2020-026](#) on 08/21/2020 and [Emergency Order 2020-024](#) on 08/18/2020 extending Emergency Order 2020-10 and Emergency Order 2020-004 for sixty (60) days.

All FDACS regional offices (except Tallahassee) are closed to the public but do allow “drop-off” of all license applications. FDACS continues accepting online and mailed license applications/renewals. Fingerprinting services for license requirements are not being provided by regional offices (except Tallahassee) at this time. FDACS accepts approved [Livescan](#) fingerprinting services for licenses issued under chapter 493. Licenses issued under chapter 790 must still be done by a law enforcement agency, FDACS or participating tax collector office. For more renewal information see [FDACS.gov here](#).

The State of Florida, Department of Agriculture, Division of Licensing’s Private Investigation, Recovery, and Security Advisory Council (PIRSAC) meeting was held on 08/07/2020 by teleconference and made available for the public. This council meets at least four times a year to advise the FDACS and make recommendations relative to regulatory concerns of the private investigative, recovery and repossession, and private security industries in Florida. See below for information from this meeting.

- The Director of the Division of Licensing (Stephen Hurm), select staff, Council members and members of the associated industries were in attendance.
- 493 and 790 license expiration dates continue to be extended. Licensees with expired and or expiring licensure should contact [FDACS](#) as soon as possible to avoid late fees associated with expirations (these fees are currently being waived).
- FDACS is reporting that Mondays are the largest consumer call counts at 2800 calls a day and other days of the week ranging from 1600 to 2200 calls per day.
- FDACS is still pursuing the pilot program in six counties to enable the use of local tax collector offices to accept class D license applications. These counties should all be operational around October of 2020.
- The form [DACS-16013](#) required for a class G license was not waived by any of the issued emergency orders.
- It is a goal for FDACS to replace paper license applications with online applications. No dates were given as to when this might begin.
- When FDACS offices reopen, they are expected to be “by appointment only” and will not have a “waiting area” available for walk in customers.

The next meeting for The Private Investigation, Recovery and Security Advisory Council is scheduled for Friday, November 13, 2020 at the Hyatt Regency Grand Cypress, Orlando, Florida. For more information contact Stefannie.Corbett@FDACS.gov.

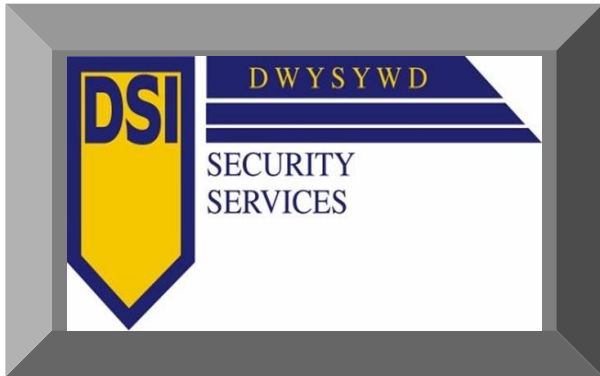

4. Actively pursue membership to fill board chair and liaison roles and establish a succession plan.
5. Engage with on-hold members to encourage membership renewal.
6. Grow membership by 15%.

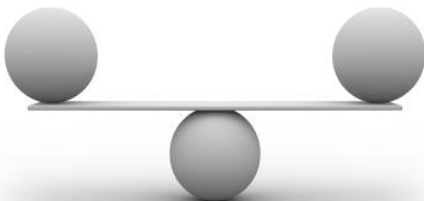
