LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Updates for the Florida PI, Security and Safety industry

Florida Commissioner of Agriculture (Nicole Fried) issues <u>Emergency Order 2020-026</u> on 08/21/2020 and <u>Emergency Order 2020-024</u> on 08/18/2020 extending Emergency Order 2020-10 and Emergency Order 2020-004 for sixty (60) days.

All FDACS regional offices (except Tallahassee) are closed to the public but do allow "drop-off" of all license applications. FDACS continues accepting online and mailed license applications/renewals. Fingerprinting services for license requirements are not being provided by regional offices (except Tallahassee) at this time. FDACS accepts approved <u>Livescan</u> fingerprinting services for licenses issued under chapter 493. Licenses issued under chapter 790 must still be done by a law enforcement agency, FDACS or participating tax collector office. The State of Florida, Department of Agriculture, Division of Licensing's Private Investigation, Recovery, and Security Advisory Council (PIRSAC) meeting was held on 08/07/2020 by teleconference and made available for the public. This council meets at least four times a year to advise the FDACS and make recommendations relative to regulatory concerns of the private investigative, recovery and repossession, and private security industries in Florida. See below for information from this meeting.

- The Director of the Division of Licensing (Stephen Hurm), select staff, Council members and members of the associated industries were in attendance.
- 493 and 790 license expiration dates continue to be extended. Licensees with expired and or
 expiring licensure should contact <u>FDACS</u> as soon as possible to avoid late fees associated with
 expirations (these fees are currently being waived).
- FDACS is reporting that Mondays are the largest consumer call counts at 2800 calls a day and other days of the week ranging from 1600 to 2200 calls per day.
- FDACS is still pursuing the pilot program in six counties to enable the use of local tax collector offices to accept class D license applications. These counties should all be operational around October of 2020.
- The form <u>DACS-16013</u> required for a class G license was not waived by any of the issued emergency orders.
- It is a goal for FDACS to replace paper license applications with online applications. No dates were given as to when this might begin.
- When FDAC offices reopen, they are expected to be "by appointment only" and will not have a "waiting area" available for walk in customers.

The next meeting for The Private Investigation, Recovery and Security Advisory Council is scheduled for Friday, November 13, 2020 at the Hyatt Regency Grand Cypress, Orlando, Florida. For more information contact Stefannie.Corbett@FDACS.gov.

EMERGING/YOUNG PROFESSIONALS

SOCIAL MEDIA TIP CARD - RELEVANT FOR ALL

As a professional, you are likely accustomed to using the Internet each and every day. NOW MORE THAN EVER, Zoom, GoToMeeting and the many other platforms out there have become part of our daily routine as well. This writing specifically addresses how the risks that come with that use could greatly impact you and your career. Making smart online decisions will help you personally and professionally throughout your life.

DID YOU KNOW 40 percent of companies have a social media policy in the workplace

SIMPLE TIPS...YES, but which ones could you do a better job with?

- 1. Trust your feelings. If something doesn't feel right when you are online, stop what you're doing. If an email or website seems suspicious, report the problem to the system administrator.
- 2. Think before you click. Don't open emails or download attachments from strangers.
- 3. Keep your personal information private. Avoid sharing your name, address, telephone number, and other personal information when using the Internet.
- 4. Remember to protect your cell phone and tablet. Use a PIN, thumb print, facial rec or password to lock the devices. The same tips for being safer online apply when you access the Internet from any device.
- 5. Make sure your profile picture is professional. This is public regardless of your privacy settings. When someone searches you on Google, they will see your profile picture.
- 6. Consider your pages for websites like Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn...it's your "live" resume. Always remember that even if you delete things, it is likely not gone forever. Google, Facebook and other companies keep a digital footprint of everything. This could in turn be a post or picture that a future employer may see.
- 7. Although it's great to network with others, be careful who you befriend. Simply because someone with mutual friends wants to add you on a website or app does not mean they are trustworthy. Think about the information you share online about yourself or your family and if you really want a person you don't know well seeing that information too.
- 8. Avoid oversharing online or in person. While it may be very exciting to share what you do at work with others, remember your organization's security standards and be careful what you share. And remember...you never know who may be overhearing your in-person conversations.
- 9. Put away your work identification or badge when out in public and when using public transportation.




