## MEMBER SPOTLIGHT



John Walsh, CPP Director, Hazmat Programs

ASIS North Florida is pleased to introduce John Walsh, CPP and welcome him to the Chapter Board as Legislative Chair



John Walsh started his career in the public sector as a police officer in the New York City Police Department. He served in several assignments in northern Manhattan before being promoted to Sergeant and serving in patrol and special assignment roles in The Bronx. He returned to northern Manhattan as a Lieutenant in a patrol precinct until he was until he was assigned as a team leader in the Internal Affairs Bureau. Walsh spent the last four years of his career as the Executive Officer of the Technical Assistance Response Unit (TARU), a citywide technical and investigative

support unit. He retired after twenty years as a Lieutenant Commander Detective Squad. Walsh vowed to do something unrelated to law enforcement, security, or investigations after retiring, but quickly realized that it was in his blood and his passion for it would not go away. In 2005 Walsh began working at CSX Transportation, Inc. as a fraud investigator in their Internal Audit Department. He transitioned to the CSX Public Safety, Health, and Environment Department in 2008 as a manager in their Infrastructure Protection Team where he was responsible for homeland security, security planning and security training. Walsh was subsequently promoted to Director of Infrastructure Protection and assumed responsibility for the CSX emergency call center. In 2015 the CSX Railroad Police Department was moved under Walsh' responsibility. Walsh accepted an early retirement offer in 2017 as part of a company reorganization.

In 2018 Walsh went to work for Genesee & Wyoming, a short line railroad holding company. As AVP of Safety and Security, Walsh was responsible for all aspects of security for 120 railroads located throughout the United States. The majority of Walsh' time at Genesee & Wyoming was spent developing relationships with local law enforcement agencies. These relationships were crucial in garnering assistance for issues in the field such as homeless encampments, theft, and vandalism. In 2020 Walsh was hired by the Short Line Safety Institute as Director of Hazmat Programs responsible for offering training to short line and regional railroads throughout the United States. The training is focused on federal hazmat regulations which includes security awareness and in-depth security training.

Transitioning into the private sector was a "slow and methodical process", Walsh said. As time went on, he started to recognize more similarities between the public and private sector than differences. "People are people. If you treat everyone from the boiler room to the board room fairly and with dignity and respect you can accomplish a lot. I've always believed there is a distinction between mistakes of the mind and mistakes of the heart. People with no mal intent sometimes make mistakes that run them afoul of the law or policies."

John has been an ASIS member since 2010 and earned his CPP in 2017. He has been married for 33 years and is the proud father of three adult children, two in the Jacksonville area and one in Denver, Colorado.

### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

### Updates for the Florida PI, Security and Safety Industry

Florida covid-19 Executive Orders can be found here.

FDACS regional offices are open and <u>office safety guidelines</u> have been posted. **All services require an appointment**. Individuals that need to make an appointment may call (850) 245-5300. For all other matters call (850) 245-5691. FDACS continues accepting online and mailed license applications/renewals. For more renewal information see FDACS.gov.

The State of Florida, Department of Agriculture, Division of Licensing's Private Investigation, Recovery, and Security Advisory Council (PIRSAC) meeting was held on 02/12/2021 by teleconference and made available for the public. This council meets at least four times a year to advise the FDACS and make recommendations relative to regulatory concerns of the private investigative, recovery and repossession, and private security industries in Florida. See below for information from this meeting.


- The Director of the Division of Licensing (Stephen Hurm), select staff, Council members and members of the associated industries were in attendance.
- Mr. Hurm stated that all regional offices should be open from 8am to 4:30pm Monday through Friday and some offices may have Saturday appointments available. Offices have been closed due to exigent circumstances and advised consumers to call ahead before attempting to use "drop off" servicing.
- FDACS is receiving 800 to 1000 calls per day. Appointments are currently booked through June. Consumers are advised to make appointments well in advance of the time that they need service.
- Security agencies not issuing company ID cards was the prominent violation during the Superbowl.
- There will be no 493 bill during the current legislative session.
- The Division of Licensing recently amended existing rule 5N-1.113, F.A.C., titled "Disciplinary Guidelines; Aggravating and Mitigating Circumstances; Range of Penalties". The text of the rule is available through this <u>link</u>.


