In a survey of more than 5,000 respondents across 99 global territories in 2020, PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) found that 47 percent had suffered at least one form of fraud in the prior 24 months—averaging six per company. These were commonly customer fraud, cybercrime, asset misappropriation, and bribery and corruption, which cost \$42 billion. Kirby Wedekind Protective Security Advisor – Northeast Florida Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency





Kirby Wedekind serves as the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's Protective Security Advisor in northeast Florida. Based in Jacksonville, his duties include serving as a liaison from CISA to local government agencies and private industry; fostering community awareness on security topics ranging from cybersecurity to active shooter preparedness; conducting vulnerability assessments of critical infrastructure; and sharing security-related information with communities of interest across northeast Florida.

The best and most important part of his work is developing trusted relationships between government and industry: "The world in which we find ourselves is characterized by interdependence between the physical, cyber, and human aspects of both infrastructure and society. In such a world, we must work together to protect what we have and set conditions for what we want the future to be. I believe the best way to accomplish these mutually-reinforcing goals is by collaborating wherever and whenever possible; to do so requires trust and confidence."

Mr. Wedekind joined the Department of Homeland Security in 2013 as a planner supporting the efforts of Protective Security Advisors. While in this role, his portfolio included strategic planning for special events and Soft Target – Crowded Places, including as one of the leaders for the creation of the Department's Soft Target – Crowded Places Security Plan that seeks to enhance the security of the inherent vulnerabilities of unprotected places across the United States. For his efforts, Mr. Wedekind received the Infrastructure Security Division's Assistant Director Medal in 2018.

Mr. Wedekind previously served for ten years in the US Marines, reaching the rank of Major with combat deployments to Iraq (2009), Afghanistan (2011-2012), and with the 22d Marine Expeditionary Unit (2016). As a combat engineer officer, Mr. Wedekind led a route clearance platoon in Iraq and served as the executive officer for a route clearance company partnered with the 1st Kandak, 215th Corps of the Afghan National Army in Afghanistan. While on active duty, he held command at the company level with Marine Wing Support Squadron 271 (MCAS Cherry Point) and 3d Combat Engineer Battalion (MCAGCC 29 Palms) and served as the operations officer for the Security Cooperation Amphibious Task Force Southern Partnership Station 2011 embarked upon the USS GUNSTON HALL while deployed in the SOUTHCOM area of responsibility. Mr. Wedekind also led a mobile training team to the Republic of Georgia in 2010 that provided instruction on obstacle and fortification construction for the Georgian Army Engineer Corps. In 2016, he mobilized from the US Marine Corps Reserves to serve as the Civil Affairs Officer for the 22d Marine Expeditionary Unit (MEU) that executed Operation ODYSSEY LIGHTNING, which eliminated the Islamic State of Irag and the Levant in Libva and its foothold in the town of Sirte. While deployed with the 22 MEU and in support of ODYSSEY LIGHTNING, Mr. Wedekind served as a liaison to Commander, Naval Forces Europe-Africa/Commander, U.S. 6th Fleet (CNE-CNA/C6F) and as the Deputy Assistant Operations Officer and Senior Watch Officer for the MEU.

A native of Jacksonville, FL, he holds a BA in English from Wake Forest University, an Executive Master's degree in Emergency and Disaster Management from Georgetown University, and is pursuing a doctorate in International Security & Resilience from Cranfield University in the United Kingdom. Kirby and his wife Allison welcomed their first child, Kirby Jr, in 2020.

Updates for the Florida PI, Security and Safety Industry

The Department of Homeland Security has extended the compliance date for obtaining a REAL ID compliant driver license or ID card until May 3, 2023.

FDACS regional offices are open and <u>office safety guidelines</u> have been posted. **All services require an appointment**. At this time, the earliest available date for appointments at the Jacksonville Regional Office is the **last week of July**. Individuals that need to make an appointment may call (850) 245-5300. For all other matters call (850) 245-5691. FDACS continues accepting online and mailed license applications/renewals. For more renewal information see <u>FDACS.gov</u>.

FDACS Private Investigation, Recovery, and Security Advisory Council (PIRSAC) meeting was held on 05/14/2021 by teleconference and made available for the public. The agenda consisted of updates on COVID 19 and the Office of Agriculture Law Enforcement. A date for the next meeting has not yet been scheduled. The Florida Legislative Session ended on April 30th. There were several bills focused on firearms including storage, sale and magazine capacity. These bills died in their respective committees. A bill allowing concealed carry licensees to carry firearms in houses of worship passed both chambers and is being sent to the governor.

A Special Session of the Legislature was called on May 17th. There is nothing of significance to report from that session.

Michelle Reaves Leading Community Partnerships for Clay County Sheriff's Office

Like many communities, Clay County Sheriff's Office has a Real Time Crime (RTCC). "Our program is unique in our approach to connect to the community", says Michelle Reaves, Real Time Crime Center Coordinator for the Clay

County Sheriff's Office. The RTCC is relatively new and launched in January of 2021. Currently the RTCC operates Monday through Friday during business hours and has plans to expand to a 24/7 operation in the future. It has been growing quickly and will be relocating to a larger facility next year with the Communications Center in Fleming Island.

Michelle joined the RTCC in April of 2020. Her position is two-fold. She assists in training new analysts on how to use the different software used in the RTCC and conducts research on different technology to increase the ease of use and functionality in the center. The other portion of her position that takes up most of her time is community outreach to creating a public/private partnership with businesses to connect their video cameras to the RTCC. When the federation is created, camera owners share their video for viewing by the RTCC. When there is an incident, the video helps detectives look at camera history for specific clues in cases. When a call comes into the 911 center, they look to see if they have cameras in the area, giving situational awareness to officers answering calls and crucial details for cases and leads.

"Covid has slowed our growth of acquiring partnerships as we were not able to meet with people face to face. We have over 100 cameras connected now, but we expect major expansion in the next three months", says Michelle. The RTCC has relationships with the Florida Department of Transportation, Keystone Public Works, Parks & Recreation, and other governmental entities. She has been attending many networking events and reaching apartment complexes, HOAs, hospitals, malls, restaurants, gas stations and hotels to engage the community. She focuses on areas with more crime to make the areas safer. "People shop and live where they feel safe. As Clay County is growing quickly, we can increase security making the community a better place to be. We are building relationships in the community bringing us all together."

The Real Time Crime Center is a new way of fighting crime and keeping businesses and neighborhoods safe. She is enjoying being on the forefront of this new development in law enforcement that bringing different parts of the community into a relationship with the Clay County Sheriff's Office. She only sees more growth opportunities ahead.
